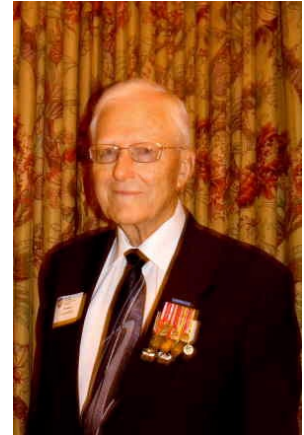


**Col. James C. Causey, 1929-2011**

**James Carroll Causey**, 82, passed away on July 18, 2011 in Houston, Texas. Born in Amagon, Arkansas and a decorated veteran, he served in the U.S. Army during WW II, and with the Army's occupational forces in Japan and Germany. It was in Berlin that he met and married Elizabeth, his wife of 60 years. He continued to serve during the Korean War and later served in the Arkansas Army National Guard and the U. S. Army Reserves until 1980, retiring with the rank of colonel. More recently, Jim proudly served as president of the Houston Area Military Officers Association of America (MOAA).



Jim graduated from the University of Arkansas with a B.S. in mechanical engineering and worked as a licensed engineer. He was a member of the Tau Beta Pi Honor Society, Academy of Experts (UK), the American Society of Mechanical Engineers and Safety Engineers, the Technical Association of the Pulp and Paper Industry, and was a certified safety professional. And, for over 25 years he worked as an independent engineering consultant.

Jim is survived by his wife Elizabeth, son James, Jr., daughters Renae Sterling, and Jane Lambert and her husband Tom. His family also includes brother Clinton Causey and wife Margie, and Dorothy Causey, wife of deceased brother Charles.

He was a devout Christian and had a lifelong passion for steam trains...rest in peace, dear Jim, on the last train home.
